School Uniform

Our pupils have begun the new school year looking smart in their new uniforms. Thank you. As part of the school uniform policy jewellery is not to be worn in school. Please note that shoes should be black in colour. Boots are not permitted. Small stud earrings are acceptable, however, they need to be removed for PE.

Until half term, summer uniform is still able to be worn. Following our return to school on 4th November our winter school uniform of collared shirts and ties is in place. Dinner money for years 3-6

The cost of dinners is £2.35 per day/£11.75 per week. Please pay all dinner money through ParentPay. You are welcome to pay weekly, monthly or termly. However all dinner money must be paid by the Friday of the week your child has a dinner. Please review your ParentPay account regularly to ensure that no monies are owed.

Morning Break Sales - Please note this money is separate to dinner money

If your child would like a smoothie, milkshake or juice during morning break
these can be purchased via ParentPay at 45p each.

You are welcome to pay weekly, monthly or termly. Children from all year groups are welcome to have these items during morning break.

Payment needs to be made by 8am on a Monday morning for the same week.

The staff in the school kitchen will not be aware of any payments made after this time and your child will not receive their drink.

For children in reception/key stage 1 - your child's class teacher will ask your child at the beginning of the week what their choice of drink will be. This can be for specific days or all week. Their drink will then be sent up to class at break time.

For children in key stage 2 - your child will choose their own drink each day and collect from the school kitchen during break time.

PTFA - Toast

If you would like your child to have toast, please send in money on Monday morning in a named envelope. Payment is preferred on a half termly basis. Curriculum at St Joseph's

During the course of the summer term the staff at St Joseph's have reviewed and renewed the curriculum that we teach to our children. Teachers have refreshed the topics that they teach to ensure that they support the children's learning more closely and engage the children with new and exciting topics.

When you receive your termly parent's overview you will be able to read more about the topics your child will be learning about. The new layout of the

parent's overviews will enable you to see the links between the topics that the children will be covering.

Topics themes will vary across each term with the areas of Geography, History, Art, Design Technology and English being linked in most cases. In class the children will have a termly topic book for all their work on the topic, which you will have an opportunity to look at on parents evening.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION: SWIMMING GOGGLES

We would ask that you inform the school in writing if you wish your child to wear goggles and that you fully understand the risks involved. Swimming for this academic year commences on Friday 13th September 2019. If your child requires goggles please ensure that school is in receipt of the permission letter below before this date.

If the permission letter is not received in time for the swimming lesson on 13th September 2019 your child will not be permitted to wear his/her goggles until written permission is received.

Staffordshire Schools' Swimming Service

Guidance notes for the use of swimming goggles in Schools (December 2008)

- 1. Goggles are not necessary within short curriculum swimming lessons (typically 20 to 25 minutes water time) or for single, short races in school galas
- 2. Goggles are intended for use in long, regular swimming sessions when:
 - a. the eyes would be exposed for long periods to the effects of the chemicals in the water

- b. the tissue around the eyes does not dry out between training sessions and thus becomes more susceptible to infection
- 3. For reasons of Safe Practice in School Sport, it is recommended that the use of goggles should <u>not</u> be allowed unless a school is satisfied that a pupil has 'exceptional circumstances' i.e through involvement in long and frequent training sessions, outside school hours, or if the individual has particularly sensitive eyes, or for some other exceptional circumstance.
- 4. Wet plastic can be slippery and, frequent, incorrect or unnecessary adjustment or removal of goggles, such as pulling them away from the eyes instead of sliding them over the forehead, could cause an eye injury and parents should be made aware of this risk.
- 5. In crowded water space there is an increased likelihood of accidental collision that may lead to eye injury by those wearing goggles.
- 6. When large numbers of pupils complain of eye irritation it is likely to be a chemical imbalance which can be easily rectified.
- 7. In the rare circumstances where the use of goggles are allowed in a school, as described in (paragraph 3), the adult responsible for the group has the right to require the pupil to remove them for reasons of safe practice if a pupil uses them inappropriately.
- 8. It is a parents' responsibility to ensure their child is able to safely apply and remove the goggles.
- 9. Certain aspects of the Water Safety and Personal Survival Award do require a pupil to remove their goggles.
- 10.A medical certificate is not essential for a school to allow a pupil to use goggles.

 However, schools do, as a minimum, require a letter from a parent stating the pupil's

'exceptional circumstances' to enable a school to consider a request for their child to use goggles during a school swimming activity.

11.Please note it is important that all parents of children who swim under the care of a school have access to these guidance notes prior to commencing a swimming activity. This will ensure that parents are aware of the current Safe Practice in School Sport guidelines referred to in this document concerning the use of goggles.
