It was great that the whole school could join together to celebrate this important event. Many thanks to Mrs Daly in the kitchen for providing a lovely jubilee picnic.

Last week the children had opportunities to learn about other faiths and traditions. Years 1 and 2 learnt all about the Hindu festival of Holi and had henna patterns painted on their hands. Year 3 also learnt about Hinduism and Year 4 Judaism. Year 5 learnt all about the Sikh faith and took part in a Sikh wedding and dance. Year 6 learnt all about Islam. The children in Nursery and Reception are enjoying playing on the new climbing frame which has been installed in their outdoor area. This, along with the new all-purpose surface, has really enhanced the outdoor area for our children. Many thanks to the PTFA and for all your support with fundraising, as the funds raised have enabled us to purchase this new equipment.



We are looking forward to Bishop Stephen visiting our school next Tuesday afternoon in preparation for the celebration of the Sacrament of Confirmation for our Year 6 pupils in Church in the evening. Please keep all of the children being confirmed next week in your prayers.

This Sunday, the Church celebrates the great feast of Corpus Christi (two Latin words which mean 'the Body of Christ'). In the Gospel we hear the story of the feeding of the 5000. Before Jesus fed the 5000 he looked up to heaven, said the blessing, broke the bread and then shared it. This was a sign of the Eucharist (Holy Communion) which Jesus would establish with his disciples at the Last Supper. Jesus makes the same offer to nourish us today, especially when we receive Holy Communion - a sacred moment, when we receive a gift from heaven - we receive Jesus. This helps us become closer to Jesus and closer to each other - to keep growing in goodness and love. Please try and make every effort to go to Mass this weekend to receive this special gift.
