### Bambinelli Mass – Sunday 11<sup>th</sup> December – 9:15am

The blessing of the Bambinelli (figures of Baby Jesus) is a tradition which began in Rome. Each year on the Third Sunday of Advent (Gaudete Sunday), the Holy Father invites children to bring figures of the Baby Jesus (Bambinelli) from the family Nativity scene to Mass for a blessing. After the blessing the children are invited to wrap up their baby Jesus and to place him under the Christmas Tree. On Christmas morning the Bambinello is the first Christmas gift to be unwrapped and placed in the family crib. Pupils in school will be making their own Bambinelli. On Sunday December 11<sup>th</sup> the parish of Our Lady of Lourdes are going to celebrate this tradition. Fr Jeremy invites the children to attend and bring their Bambinelli (made in school or from home) for blessing.

Pupils in year 4 and 5 will lead the Mass which begins at 9:15am. Following Mass there will be refreshments in the church hall where the school steel band will be performing.


## Nativity Plays
